





Industry Outlook & COVID-19

- Construction was designated as an essential service, so work continues despite the lockdown with enhanced health and safety measures.
- Historic infrastructure investments have already been identified as part of the economic recovery and to meet climate change goals.
- The Toronto region will continue to grow and that will require more housing, transit, social services and other industrial, commercial, and institutional buildings.

Since 2014, BOLT's support for skilled training programs has lead to more than 125 apprenticeships.





To date, BOLT has provided more than 420 scholarships totaling \$1.3 million.



BOLT Award Benefits

- Successful candidates receive \$3,000 or \$5,000 for the school year, depending on the type and length of their program.
- Financial support is available for the duration of the program, so successful recipients can re-apply for subsequent years of study.
- Impartial education and career advice and mentorship opportunities.
- Access to co-op and summer internship opportunities.
- Upon graduation, every effort is made to help connect BOLT youth to employment within the construction industry.



Eligibility Criteria

- ✓ You have applied to the college or university program by the prescribed deadline and can provide proof of acceptance into the program.
- ✓ You can demonstrate financial need.
- ✓ You are a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident between the ages of 17-29 living in the Greater Toronto Area.
- ✓ You are or will be a full-time student in one of the designated programs.
- ✓ If you're applying for subsequent years of support, you can provide an Enrollment Verification letter and transcripts.
- ✓ You are passionate about a career in construction.



Application Package

What you'll need to prepare:

- Completed application
- Transcripts (official or unofficial)
- Confirmed application/acceptance letter for program
- OSAP Funding Summary (screenshot of grants & loans from OSAP website)
- Most-recent CRA Notice of Assessment or tax return
- □ ONE of the following:
 - T4 slip of most-recent employment
 - Letter from your employer confirming wages
 - Photocopy of cheque stub or social assistance stub
- Two letters of reference regarding your academic, work, or community/volunteer achievements
